Impactful Research for **Impactful Actions**



With the vision of "Being a Top 5 Hotel Management College of South Asia within 5 years" (GATE, 2023), GATE has been focusing its mission on "Academic Excellence", "Linking Education and Employment" and "Impactful Research". As impactful research is the key mission, GATE always focuses on the relevant projects that lead toward meaningful research. One of the reasons to have impactful research in its mission is to have a sustainable implication with empirical evidence for impactful actions to support the national and international hospitality industry.

Among a significant number of impactful research-based projects, our undergraduate students were engaged in various national and international projects. In April 2023, 30 students from semester I were selected for the "Food, Safety, and Hygiene Project," a collaborative project of GATE College and Urban Health Promotion Center (UHPC) to know the status of food safety, food hygiene,

and workplace safety. The research field was allocated to the 50 eateries of Ward 30 of Kathmandu municipality. To achieve the objective of the project, students were divided into 10 groups having 3 members in each group. Further, pre-field training was provided to the students by experts with 1 mentor for each group to support them in the field. During the field, students succeeded in achieving the essence of real cases and became aware that multifarious needs to be addressed for Food safety. As GATE's alumni also worked as "Food Inspector", so this project motivates students to be "Food Inspector" as profession in the future. After the completion of the field, a students' conference was held at GATE College to share their experiences and outcomes as per the checklists submitted by UHPC

Furthermore, GATE initiated an international collaborative project named "Co-Creative Research in Green Destinations" with NHL



Stenden University of Applied Sciences, The Netherlands. In this project six graduate students from NHL Stenden University and six undergraduate students from GATE College spent together for four weeks together (April-May, 2023) to accomplish an empirical-based research project in the research area of (i) CO-FI farming, (ii) Pachabhaiya Community Cultural Development, and (iii) The Trekking Industry in Pokhara. To accomplish this project, students from both NHL Stenden University and GATE were divided into 3 major groups (as per the above-mentioned area) having 4 members in each group with 2 each from NHL and GATE. This research project consisted of 3 major phases: (i) Pre-field phase: In this phase, 12 students were trained about the research methodology with instruments and detailed mechanism of research protocols. This phase was done in GATE, Kathmandu. After this, (ii) Field Phase: In this phase, 12 students traveled to Pokhara and stayed there for 2 weeks @ GATE Vocational (also known as FAB School)

to collect the required qualitative as well as quantitative data where students observed various lakes, did interviews with multifarious communities, national level governments officers as well as local key-stakeholders. To support the students, 3 mentors (1 from NHL Stenden University, The Netherlands, and 2 from GATE, Nepal) were assigned throughout the project. After this, students traveled back to GATE, Kathmandu to accomplish the third phase named (iii) Post-field phase: In this phase, students did an analysis of qualitative and quantitative data under the supervision of assigned mentors for a week and presented their findings and recommendations during the "Student Conference".





GATE believed that education should not be limited to the four walls of the classroom. In the 21st century, content knowledge of the subject is not enough, thus, at GATE we have been integrating theories and practicals in such a way that students can understand the sound level of theories with their application in the relevant field so that students can maintain their motivation level by knowing the relevance of the subject matter. For that, we believe that project-based research can be a positive catalyst.

So, dare to dream, dare to explore, and dare to grow, for the world is full of boundless possibilities.








Saurav Bhattarai 24th Batch

I had knowledge of the field of hospitality, though I was not planning to be involved in the education sector as a teacher (Instructor). At my accidental turning point, I joined one of the renowned hospitality colleges Global Academy of Tourism and Hospitality Education where my expertise could execute for Hospitality management education students for six years and as an instructor in Bachelor in Professional Hospitality Management education affiliated Kathmandu University students for 3 years.

I wanted diverse discourses on educational leadership and its dimensions at the national and international levels to develop my students' behavioral skills, knowledge, and strategic competency in managing education. I believe having those skills with my students helps them analytical skills, creative thinking, and knowledge to assess the challenges and opportunities in the field of education and develop modalities to address the challenges.

For educators, understanding the sociocultural context of education is essential who is creating a learning environment that is inclusive of people of various backgrounds and sensitive to the needs of students on a cultural level. Teachers may use educational, sociological, psychological, and sociocultural theories and viewpoints to understand the many social and academic situations in which they work, "the sociocultural or patterns in the social world (socialites), socio-cultural context, social structure is grounded in and fosters the psychological" (Markus, 2007, pp. 3-39) This is how I unexpectedly became a leader in an educational institute by navigating ups and downs without planning or effort. Later, I put my professional plans into action and changed my field to education as a hospitality leader. In terms of leading education in society, I feel quite optimistic.

I was thrilled with logical and internal inconsistencies, conceptual ambiguity, incompleteness and confusion associated with multiple version of the model are challenged for robustness and pragmatic. I have a situational leadership style, blended education philosophy, and pragmatics teaching way, creating a vision to guide the change through inspiration, and executing the change intended with committed members of students for positive outcomes for industry readiness. As highlighted by Day (2014), resilient leadership is the crucial component of leaders who could mitigate future hurdles to support students, management, colleagues, and most importantly society.

I am feeling proud of the success of students and their achievements, which influenced society by broader social and cultural factors, and religious work. They can experience relaxation, and success and be satisfied by the positive response, their deeds, contribution, and elite position in the society for uplifting, development, and society.

Educational leaders can play a critical role in promoting social justice and equity in education, given the risks to be strategic to pursue their activism (Ryan, 2016). By recognizing and valuing the cultural diversity of their students, teachers can create a learning environment that is respectful, inclusive, and supportive of all students. This includes incorporating diverse perspectives and experiences into the curriculum, using culturally relevant teaching strategies, and creating opportunities for students to share their cultural backgrounds and experiences.

In conclusion, Educational leaders play a crucial role in the sociocultural framework of education. The different needs of their learners must be recognized by teachers, who must then use this knowledge to provide an inclusive and culturally sensitive learning environment. To advance equality and social justice in their communities, educational leaders may also serve as leaders and agents of social change. For society's evolution, teachers can serve as role models. They ought to lead society in a way that is both exemplary and as a role model for the students as well as for society.

Chetan Bhagat quotes that "Life is tough when you are always talking to people smarter than you" compared to my biography how I started my career and how I struggled and how I became from teacher to hotelier and instructor accidentally where there was no plan with me. Overall, a teacher's role through a socio-cultural lens is to promote a learning environment that is inclusive, culturally responsive, and supportive of all students. By recognizing the diverse backgrounds and experiences of their students and addressing social and cultural issues, teachers can help create a more equitable and just society.





Certificate- III in **Commercial Cookery**

Certificate III in Commercial Cookery is a basic qualification that gives one a basic knowledge of the cuisine theory and enables to start a career in the culinary field. The course requires completion of selected compulsory units/ subjects and a few electives. Successful completion of the course offers a pathway to start a career as a commercial cook in the industry. This course is offered in affiliation with The Technical and Further Education (TAFE), New South Wales in Australia for the first time in Nepal here at GATE. TAFE is the largest and oldest vocational training institute in Australia with a history of over 120 years of providing vocational education, with over 500,000 enrollments each year and over 1000 courses offered at various campuses.

After completing the qualification, individuals can process Certificate in Commercial IV Cookery or Certificate IV in Catering Operations or Certificate IV in Patisserie at TAFE Institute Australia. Competency individuals is judged on their performance in units such as special diets, food safety, hygienic practices, menu costing, customer service to name a few.

Certificate III in **Commercial COOKERY**

Australian National Qualification at GATE

Recognition of Prior Learning

This qualification offers an option to fast track your career through Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL). RPL is a provision under which working Chefs can also enroll for this course and earn Certificate III. Ideal for those who have worked several years in the industry but have no proper qualification.

Requirement for RPL is the proof that individuals have those competencies. It could be based on the years of experience in a particular area or in a particular position. Professional experiences will be counted and individuals under this provision may not be required to enroll for some units again which is based on their knowledge and past working experiences.

Is this a good career choice?

The career as a Chef is highly demanding, higher-end jobs such as of an Executive Chef demand long work days, with weekends and holidays typically included due to the hospitality industry's tendency to be busy during these times. However, the job outlook for those wanting to enter the culinary field is positive employee turnover due to and the growing number of establishments needing Chefs worldwide. Outlook projections vary by the type of Chef an individual wishes to be, though most culinary fields have an average to better-than-average outlook. Also, individuals who aspire to an upper-end culinary position must consider the time, hard work and expectations involved.
